







On-Resistance vs. Drain Current and Gate Voltage




Gate Charge



Transfer Characteristics




Capacitance




On-Resistance vs. Junction Temperature


On-Resistance vs. Gate-to-Source Voltage


V_{GS} - Gate-to-Source Voltage (V)



Threshold Voltage




Single Pulse Power, Junction-to-Ambient




Safe Operating Area, Junction-to-Ambient









Power, Junction-to-Ambient

a. The power dissipation P_D is based on T_J max. = 150 °C, using junction-to-case thermal resistance, and is more useful in settling the upper dissipation limit for cases where additional heatsinking is used. It is used to determine the current rating, when this rating falls below the package limit
